AIMS AND OBJECTIVES

This workshop aims to examine how lifelong learning can develop strategies to contribute to regional development. The workshop will examine how universities are responding to the needs of the economy and how they are meeting the social and cultural needs of diverse groups of adult learners. The workshop will also examine strategies for the development of access programmes which widen participation to education and training and in so doing, reducing social inequalities in lifelong learning.

The workshop will have both speakers and small group discussion.

Key objectives of the workshop are to:

- **Examine and discuss** national and European lifelong learning policies
- Discuss the roles **how** universities **might play** in **promoting** regional development through lifelong learning **programmes and activities (which include teaching; research; coordination)**
- Improve knowledge on **various** aspects of lifelong learning, **and in particular about practices in widening participation.**
- **Examine** ways in which **partnerships can be established** between universities and local / regional stakeholders
- **Discuss new ways of working between Universities and the lifelong learning sector, particularly how to develop new mechanisms for cooperation between businesses, sectors and universities**

This course is primarily designed for various groups of professionals working in the field of lifelong learning and who have a background knowledge of and/or interest in promoting education for adults in universities.
